Event: Celebrating 125 years of Agatha Christie
Release of Kathryn Harkup's 'A is for Arsenic: The Poisons of Agatha Christie'

Kolkata, 15th January, 2016: Apeejay Kolkata Literary Festival 2016 commemorated the 125th birth anniversary of Agatha Christie, the grande dame of crime fiction, with the launch of Kathryn Harkup's, '*A is for Arsenic: The Poisons of Agatha Christie*', a fascinating look at the poisons Christie used to kill her characters.

Presented in association with Bloody Scotland!- Scotland's International Crime Writing Festival, the launch was followed by an intriguing discussion on Agatha Christie with author of the book **Kathryn Harkup**, also a chemist and a science communicator; **Dom Hastings**, Director of Bloody Scotland; **Anuja Chauhan**, popular young adult writer and **Sujata Sen** Director, East India, British Council. During the riveting discussion, Kathryn offered unique insights into the work of perhaps the most popular author in the world who is still an influence and inspiration to crime writers around the world today.

Kathryn's background as an avid Agatha Christie reader and chemist with a doctorate on her chemicals makes her perfectly placed to investigate just how much science fact went into the fiction of Agatha Christie's novels. Her book '*A is for Arsenic: The Poisons of Agatha Christie*' is a fascinating read, investigating fourteen of the poisons Christie used in her books, looking at the scientific reality behind the poisons, the feasibility of getting hold of them, administering them, and detecting them historically as well as in modern times, and comparing actual cases with the murders written in Christie's books. The session was moderated by **Sumit Ray** at the vast green lawns of Tollygunge Club.

AKLF highlights several unique concepts with a fresh approach that reflects current concerns such as diversity, gender equality, continuities across borders and youth engagements, which are also broad themes running through the festival. AKLF signature heritage sites include Nandan, Town Hall steps, The Indian Museum, Presidency University, Tollygunge Club and Victoria Memorial. AKLF 2016 has participation from Australia, Israel, Scotland, Italy, Nigeria, Portugal as well as England, France, Germany, Pakistan, Bhutan and others. Some of the prominent personalities who will be part of the literary extravaganza are Ben Okri, Meera Syal, Christine Manfield, Ashis Nandy, Vir Sanghvi, Bharathi S Pradhan, Shatrughan Sinha, Shobhaa De and more. The four day long, multi-faceted event has several stimulating components designed to give visitors and the audience an enriching experience, with a great blend of literature, culture, art and heritage. And all of this is absolutely free for Kolkata and her culture-loving audience.

Kathryn Harkup is a chemist, science communicator and author of *A is for Arsenic: The Poisons of Agatha Christie* (2015). She is passionate about communicating how amazing science can be and has delivered talks and conducted workshops at various science festivals and schools across the South East as well as organisations such as The Hungarian Museum, The Training Partnership, RHS Wisley and The Royal Institution of Great Britain.

Dom Hastings is the Director of Bloody Scotland, Scotland's International Crime Writing Festival, an annual event to celebrate crime fiction from Scotland. Based in Glasgow, Scotland, Dom works to showcase Scottish literature internationally.

Anuja Chauhan is an Indian author and advertiser, often described as the best writer of the Indian commercial fiction genre. She worked in the advertising agency, JWT India, for over 17 years eventually becoming vice-president and executive creative director, before resigning in 2010 to pursue a full-time literary career. As a writer, she is best known for her best-selling, contemporary "rom-com" novels, *The Zoya Factor* (2008), *Battle For Bittora* (October 2010) and *Those Pricey Thakur Girls* (January 2013). Her new novel, a jump sequel to *Those Pricey Thakur Girls*, released in May 2015 is titled *The House That BJ Built*.

Sujata Sen is the Director (East India) of British Council. She is also the Director of British Council Management Services, NOIDA. Before joining the British Council she has been a journalist, columnist and a publishing editor. She holds honorary positions in various organizations and Trusts. She has produced books for the Nepal and Bhutan markets, and was also Head of Marketing for all of East India, including north-east, Nepal, Bhutan and Bangladesh. Sen has authored two books viz, *Gender Studies* and *Women Rights and Empowerment*. She is the Chair for Future Hope (www.futurehope.net); a Trustee for the Telegraph Education Foundation; Governing Committee Member at the Calcutta School of Music as well as a member of the West Bengal Heritage Commission.
